

Patient Instructions for Sputum Collection

- 1. Collect the specimen in the morning after you first wake.
 - a. A sample may be collected at any time for patients who have a deep cough that is readily productive.
- 2. Gargle and rinse your mouth with plain water just prior to collecting.
- 3. Take a very deep breath and hold for 5 seconds. Slowly breathe out. Take another deep breath and cough hard, deeply from within the chest until some sputum comes up into your mouth.
- 4. Spit the sputum into the plastic cup provided by your provider or laboratory.
 - a. Do not spit saliva into the container saliva and upper respiratory secretions are not sputum and are not acceptable specimens, which may lead to rejection of the sample.
 - b. One to three milliliters (approximately 1 teaspoon) of sputum is sufficient.
- 5. Screw the cap back on the container, making sure it is threaded properly to prevent leakage.
- 6. Label the specimen cup with your full first and last name, birth date, and date/time of collection.
 - a. *Incorrectly or incompletely labeled specimens will not be tested.
- 7. Place the labeled specimen container into the plastic zip-lock bag. Return the specimen to the nearest Aspirus laboratory as soon as possible.
 - a. The specimen may be refrigerated for not more than three hours before returning to the laboratory.
 - b. Prolonged delays will affect test results and may result in your sample needing to be recollected.
- 8. Report to the registration desk upon arrival with the specimen. Reception will register you and assist in directing the sample to the lab.
